ITINERARY

Day 1 May 24, Thursday: Depart for Ireland

Depart Kansas City and Hartsfield-Jackson Atlanta International Airport for your overseas journey to Dublin via Delta Airlines. Complimentary meals and beverages will be served aloft. (D)

Day 2 May 25, Friday: AM/Arrive Dublin - Boyne Valley/Hill of Tara & Hill of Slane - Monasterboice - Armagh

Upon morning arrival at Dublin Airport, proceed through Passport Control, claim your luggage, and a Peter's Way Tours tour manager/guide will meet you upon your exit from Customs. Board your motor coach, and you will be on your way to the historic Boyne Valley, without a doubt the most historical region of the whole island. Therefore it is not surprising to find the most important Irish monuments here such as Newgrange, Knowth or Loughcrew Cairns. These are megalithic tombs, dating from 2500 BC, located along the valley of the river Boyne. Independent lunch.

Visit the **Hill of Tara**, once the residence of the High Kings of Ireland. In pre-historic times, 142 kings are said to have reigned here. In the early Christian period, Tara was the political and religious center of Ireland. Saint Patrick himself is said to have visited Tara. There are over thirty monuments remaining today. The earliest settlement at the site is Neolithic, while the Mound of the Hostages was constructed in or around 2500 BC. Early in the 20th century, a group of Israelites came to Tara with the conviction that the *Arc of the Covenant* was buried in on the famous hill. Alas, they only found some Roman coins. Tara has an excellent Interpretative Centre, which presents an excellent audio-visual on Tara's rich history.

Visit the **Hill of Slane**. Tradition holds that St. Patrick lit a Pascal (Easter) fire here in 433 to proclaim Christianity throughout Ireland. This was in direct contravention of a decree by the High King that no flame should be lit within sight of his home on the hill of Tara. When Patrick was brought before the King he convinced the king to allow Christianity to be preached throughout Ireland. It is said that it was during a meeting with the high king that Patrick used the shamrock to explain the complexities of the Trinity resulting in the Shamrock becoming the emblem of the Irish nation.

Visit **Monasterboice**, one of the most famous religious sites in the country, built in the 5th century a few miles north of Drogheda in a lovely, secluded setting. It is said that St. Buith, a follower of St. Patrick, founded this monastic site. The treasure of this site is the High Cross of Muiredach, the Abbott in Monasterboice until 922. The prayer at the base of the cross is translated as "a prayer for Muiredach for whom the cross was made." Considered the finest High Cross in the country, it is the pinnacle of achievement with many sculpted biblical scenes, which are still legible today. Hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Armagh. (B,D)

Day 3 May 26, Saturday: Armagh - Downpatrick - Evening/Concert

Irish breakfast at your hotel. Begin our day with a visit to Armagh, the spiritual capital of Ireland for 1,500 years and the seat of both Protestant and Catholic archbishops. St. Patrick called Armagh "my sweet hill" and built his stone church on the hill where the Anglican Cathedral now stands. On the opposite hill, the twin-spired Catholic Cathedral, started in 1840, is flanked by two large marble archbishops who look mildly across town. Independent lunch. Continue through 'St. Patrick Country' to the historic town of Downpatrick, the traditional burial place of Saint Patrick, marked by a granite boulder at Down's Anglican St. Patrick's Cathedral. A visit to Down County Museum enables you to experience the recently restored 18th century County Gaol; stories of the convicts; the county's history;

St. Patrick; and early Christianity. We also visit St. Patrick's Centre, a new and exciting interpretative exhibition that tells the fascinating story of Ireland's Patron Saint. Through Patrick's own words a light is shone on the arrival of Christianity in Ireland and its development through his mission. A series of interactive displays allow visitors to explore how Patrick's legacy developed in early Christian times and reveal the fabulous artwork and metalwork that was produced during this Golden Age. The exhibition also examines the major impact of Irish missionaries in Dark Age Europe - a legacy that remains to this day. Return to your hotel to freshen up.

This evening, you will be transferred to St. Patrick's Cathedral, Church of Ireland, in Armagh for a formal concert sung by the Sacred Heart Church Choir. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Armagh. (B,D)

Day 4 May 27, Sunday: AM/Mass - PM/Sligo

Irish breakfast at your hotel. **Transfer to St. Patrick's Catholic Cathedral in Armagh for 9:00 am Mass sung by the Sacred Heart Church Choir (subject to confirmation).**

After Mass, we leave Armagh for Sligo. Independent lunch en route to County Sligo, known for the beautiful scenery that was an inspiration for Yeats, who is buried at Drumcliff Churchyard, under loaf-shaped Benbulbin Mountain. The lakes of Sligo, with their still waters and wooded islands, are truly spectacular, and form a striking contrast to the county's rugged uplands. The imposing Neolithic cairn on the summit of Knocknarea, known locally as Queen Maeve's grave, is a remarkable landmark. Sligo's scenic coast has some excellent surfing beaches, including Strandhill, Rosses Point and Enniscrone, also popular for their golf courses. Lissadell House, once home to Countess Markievicz, is a good family attraction, with a lovely beach nearby. Visit **Carrowmore Cemetery**, which has over 60 stone circle and passage tombs, making it one of the largest Stone Age cemeteries in Europe. It is the oldest Megalithic cemetery in Ireland. Each tomb is numbered to facilitate the visitor and the central tomb has been restored and enables visitors to visit the interior of a court tomb and see how it was when it was built over 5,000 years ago. Hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Sligo. (B,D)

Day 5 May 28, Monday: Kylemore Abbey - Connemara - Galway

Irish breakfast at your hotel. Today, leave Sligo for Galway. En route, enjoy a tour of the Connemara region. Visit **Kylemore Abbey**, located in the Kylemore Pass in Connemara. One of Kylemore Abbey's most famous features is its miniature cathedral, built in 1870 and known locally as the Gothic church. Today, the abbey is home to the Irish order of Benedictine nuns. They bought the house in 1920, having fled their convent in war-torn Belgium in 1914. They established a private school for young girls, which today is the renowned Kylemore Abbey International School for young girls. Facilities at Kylemore include a visitor center, gift shop, restaurant, an exhibition housed in the main reception rooms of the house, and a video that takes the visitor through the history of the house and its occupants. **Celebrate Mass at the Abbey Chapel.** Independent lunch.

This is the country of the "Quiet Man" and "The Purple Taxi" - two famous films made in this region. Connemara is a land of lakes and rivers, bogs and mountains, and small villages where Gaelic is still the spoken language and little has changed since the beginning of time. Connemara is a vast peninsula bordered by the arid and rocky coastline of Galway Bay in the south - a land characteristic for its stone walls and thatched cottages. On its northern shore, the land is harsher and more secret, with spectacular views of the ocean and the beautiful fjord of Killary Harbor, as well as the steep mountains overlooking numerous lakes and large bog areas. Dinner and overnight at hotel in Galway. (B,D)

Day 6 May 29, Tuesday: Burren Region – Cliffs of Moher – Killarney

Irish breakfast at hotel. Today, we leave Galway and drive through the spectacular Burren region. 'Boirean' is Irish for 'Rocky.' It got its name from its polished limestone landscape. It is a glaciokarstic plateau with porous carboniferous limestone and shale systems. At the end of the Stone Age, nearly 6,000 years ago, farmers arrived and left their animals grazing. This, along with natural weathering, stripped the soil of vegetation leaving the rocky landscape behind. With its rich liana and fauna, the whole area is heaven for geologists and botanists. Stop at **Cliffs of Moher**. The most majestic cliffs in Ireland rise from the Atlantic Ocean at 215 meters and extend for over seven kilometers. From this height, you can admire the Aran Islands, the Connemara Mountains and listen to the many sea birds that colonize this place from springtime on. Independent lunch en route.

Continue along the coast to Killarney. After a short boat ride across the mouth of the river Shannon, land on Kerry's shore at Tarbert. Continue to Killarney for hotel check-in.

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Killarney.

Day 7 May 30, Wednesday: AM/Killarney Lakes & Muckross House - PM/At Leisure

After Irish breakfast, a treat is in store for you. Enjoy a half-day tour of Killarney and have a relaxing 90-minute **cruise of Lough Leane**. "Lough Leane" translates to the Lake of Learning, a four-mile lake dotted with 30 small islands. The name comes from the famous Abbey at Inisfallen that has occupied the center of the Lake since the seventh century. Ross Castle sits at one edge of the lake, and Inisfallen is on an island in its midst. The green hills of Killarney rise green and mist-covered all about, giving this location a mystical and haunting aspect that is difficult to forget. Continue to visit **Muckross House and Gardens**. Built in 1843 by the Herbert Family, in Elizabethan style, this house is one of the most sumptuous residences in Ireland. Surrounded by beautiful gardens, particularly famous for its rhododendrons, Muckross House is in the heart of the Killarney National Park, the first such park opened in Ireland. Independent lunch followed by leisure in Killarney.

Late this afternoon, transfer to Killarney Cathedral to attend the scheduled evening Mass as sung by the Sacred Heart Church Choir.

Dinner and overnight at Hotel in Killarney.

Day 8 May 31, Thursday: Rock of Cashel – Dublin

Irish breakfast at hotel. Today, we leave Ennis or Limerick to visit the **Rock of Cashel**. Possibly the most photographed site in Ireland, the Rock of Cashel is one of Ireland's leading tourist attractions. Towering over the town of Cashel from its perch on a 200-foot high outcrop of limestone, the Rock of Cashel was once the seat of the Kings of Munster. St. Patrick visited the rock in 450, while Brian Boru was crowned the 1st high King of Ireland here in the tenth century. Today, impressive stonewalls enclose a round tower, a cathedral, a twelfth century Romanesque chapel and high crosses.

Independent lunch.

This afternoon, we continue to Dublin. Check-in at hotel in Dublin.

Late this afternoon, depart for **St. Teresa or St. John & St. Augustine Church for the 6:00 pm Mass, sung by the Sacred Heart Church Choir.**

Dinner and overnight at hotel in Dublin.

Day 9 June 1, Friday: Highlights Tour of Dublin - Afternoon at Leisure – Evening/Farewell Dinner

Irish breakfast at your hotel. Today, we discover Dublin's 'Fair City'. This tour will allow you to take in all the sights, including the famous 'Doors of Dublin', the elegant Georgian squares, and Phoenix Park. Highlights of the tour will be a visit to Trinity College to view the 8th century illustrated manuscript, *The Book of Kells*, followed by a visit to St. Patrick's Cathedral, Ireland's largest Cathedral made famous by its former dean Jonathan Swift, author of "Gulliver's Travels." Built in 1213, this Gothic Cathedral, with a splendid interior, is adorned with Funeral Monuments, such as The Boyle Family Memorial and the grave of Dean Jonathan Swift (Dean of St. Patrick's 1713-1745). The Chancel has ornate stained-glass windows, some by Harry Clarke, which are magnificent features. Independent lunch.

Enjoy the afternoon at leisure in Dublin City.

We recommend a stroll down Grafton Street where you can enjoy the best in street entertainment and a coffee in Bewley's Café. The shopping is also great in this area of the city! Perhaps you will visit the Guinness Storehouse to see how this famous brewery was established and how the popular black brew is created. Enjoy a sampling.

This evening, enjoy dinner and entertainment at The Merry Ploughboy Pub. (The former show at Taylor's Three Rock has moved to a different venue in January 2007.) This is a state-of-the-art music venue open seven nights a week, all year round. Their lively show features contemporary Irish dancing and well-known guest artists. Fine food is a very important element. At The Merry Ploughboy Pub, youthful vibrancy has successfully combined with traditional craftsmanship to provide an excellent evening entertainment.

Overnight at hotel in Dublin.

Day 10 June 2, Saturday: Return from Dublin

Irish breakfast at your hotel. You will be transferred this morning by coach to Dublin Airport for your flight home.

Moreover, Peter's Way Tours is not responsible for the denial of services by any carriers, hotels, restaurants, or other independent suppliers.

CANCELLATIONS/REFUNDS: From the time your deposit is received up to 130 days prior to departure, there is a \$250.00 nonrefundable cancellation fee per person. From 129 to 100 days prior to departure, the cancellation fee will be \$350.00 per person. For cancellations received from 99 days prior up to the day of departure the cancellation fee will be 100% of package price per person including taxes, single supplement, deviations fees and any other costs incurred (if applicable). (Travel insurance is offered as protection in case of illness, please see TRAVEL INSURANCE). **Tour participation is nontransferable. Names cannot be transferred on reservations or airline tickets.** Refund requests (if applicable) can only be honored when submitted in writing to Peter's Way Tours. All refund requests are subject to cancellation restrictions as set forth above. No refund will be made for any accommodations or services included in the tour that you do not use.

TRAVEL DOCUMENTS: All participants must have a valid passport. U.S. Passports must be valid for at least six (6) months, subsequent to return date. Special entry requirements for non-U.S. citizens may apply. Please consult the appropriate Consulate for current requirements. It is solely the passenger's responsibility to ensure that all documents needed are completed and current. Peter's Way Tours will not be held responsible for lack of current and valid entry documents.

SERVICE CHARGES: All service charges and local taxes as imposed by hotels are included in the program rate. Although service charges are included, it is customary to leave Euro 1.00 per person for the waiters after each meal; Euro 1.00 per person per day for the maid/bell boys.

TIPPING: For good work, recommended (but voluntary) tipping to your driver is Euro 2.00 per passenger per day; to the tour manager/guide Euro 4.00 per passenger per day, for the local guides Euro 1.50 per passenger per day. Tips for the bus driver and tour manager/guide are normally given as a group at the end of the tour. Other gratuities are usually handled individually.

TRAVELER HEALTH ADVISORY: All passengers must ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel and that such traveling will not endanger themselves or others as pilgrimages entail a lot of walking, climbing up/down stairs, etc. Any passenger who is physically challenged must submit a certificate from his/her medical doctor stating that he/she is capable of taking part in this pilgrimage without assistance. If special assistance is required, the passenger must travel with a companion willing and capable of providing any necessary assistance.

TRAVEL INSURANCE: It is strongly recommended that all participants buy insurance when they travel since the tour operator is not responsible for lost or damaged luggage or trip interruption. Peter's Way Tours offers an optional Passenger Travel Protection Plan. These benefits and services help insure the well being of the passenger while traveling worldwide. The plan payments are based on total package price, including departure taxes, fuel surcharges, single supplements, deviation fees, late charges, etc. The plan payment for total package prices from \$0 to \$2,100.00 is \$139; \$2,101.00 to \$3,000.00 is \$175.00; from \$3,001.00 and over is \$199.00. **If the plan payment is made at the time of deposit or within 10 days of receiving the Peter's Way Tours "Tour Deposit Acknowledgment Letter," the passenger will be covered for pre-existing conditions. However, the insurance plan can be purchased at anytime thereafter, excluding Coverage for pre-existing conditions, until final payment has been made.
