We're so glad you're here!





Reflect on the Word

First Reading: The final prophecy in the Book of Isaiah speaks about the end times when God will gather “all nations and tongues” and all the world will finally see the full “glory” of God. Why do you think this event has been revealed to us?

Second Reading: Our author of Hebrews speaks of the trials and tribulations of our lives as a “discipline” from God meant to teach and train us. Can you think of a lesson learned from some difficult situations in your life?

Gospel: As Jesus continues on his journey to Jerusalem, he teaches the crowds about the urgency to accept his invitation for salvation. Why do you think so many people lack this sense of urgency for their own salvation?

Virtus Training Update

All volunteers, along with parish and school staff who volunteer or work with children or youth of the Archdiocese are required to take the class ahead of volunteering or working within the parish. The training is currently being conducted online at virtus.org **Online training will be possible ONLY until September 19.** After September 19, volunteers will be required to attend an in person training session. We will not be able to host these trainings at Sacred Heart easily due to our space limitations during construction. If training is needed volunteers will most probably need to travel to other parish locations. Virtus requires anyone 16 years or older that works with or around children to be VIRTUS trained and in compliance with up-to-date continuing education provided in bulletins.

When you register, please do so from a laptop or PC but not from a smartphone or tablet. Once completed, if you will be volunteering/working around children on a weekly basis you will receive monthly Virtus bulletins to the email address you registered with. It is **mandatory** that these highly informative bulletins are completed monthly (completion takes maybe 5 minutes). It is also mandatory that you complete any additional training modules that the Archdiocese may assign to you. Go to virtus.org for the online training!



First Class Relic of John Paul II - August 21-22

The faithful of the Archdiocese of Kansas City, Kansas, will have the unique opportunity to venerate the official pilgrim relic of the liquid blood of St. John Paul II – the only one of its kind that travels the world for veneration. The blood, which has never congealed, was taken from the holy pontiff the last days of his life and is contained in a glass vessel at the center of a sacred reliquary that reminds us of the life and legacy of the unforgettable pope: an open book of the Gospels with the pages being blown open by the wind similar to the one placed upon his casket during the Mass of his funeral. On one side the book has sculpted the familiar image of St. John Paul II holding the papal crozier; on the other side is an engraved image of his pontifical shield with his inaugural words as pope, “Be not afraid!”

The relic has been entrusted by Msgr. Slawomir Oder, the postulator of St. John Paul II's cause for canonization, to Mother Adela Galindo, Foundress of the religious Institute of the Servants of the Pierced Hearts of Jesus and Mary, to be brought throughout the continent of America. Veneration is at **St. Michael the Archangel in Leawood:**

Discipline is necessary for us to focus our attention and develop and refine our skills. A disciplined person has integrity and can make difficult but necessary choices. Most people do not like discipline, especially children. When we have to rise above our impulses and desires and do something challenging, it can appear as a punishment. The struggles of living a good and effective Christian life, especially when we actively choose virtue over vice, are allowed by God and necessary for reaching spiritual maturity. God invites us to share in His Kingdom. Hearing and accepting that invitation requires an active, conscious decision on our part. Reforming our lives and changing how we do things does not come easily. But it is precisely what is necessary for us to enter through the narrow gate that leads to life. Discipline is essential if we are going to discover our desire for union with our Creator and live in God's house. In this way, we will not risk finding the door locked when we need it to be open.





Youth Formation

Youth Ministry Volunteers

Do you love Jesus and working with teenagers? Do you have a desire to journey with young people as they find their identity and purpose and ask the hard life questions? Do you have a heart of service to listen to, encourage and build relationships with young people? Small group mentors are the heart and soul of the Youth Ministry experience. Our mentors come from all different backgrounds and have different gifts. One of the main tasks of a small group mentor is to lead discussion and activities during Youth Ministry sessions with a co-leader. Session plans are e-mailed out in advance so leaders can review and prepare before each session. Teens need to belong in order to believe. Small groups give them an environment where they are known, loved and cared for. Our Middle School & High School Youth Ministry programs are looking for adult volunteers on Wednesday and Sunday nights. Our Middle School program is in great need of volunteers on Wednesday nights. We have 2 meeting times: 4:30-5:45 or 6:30-7:45 from September to April. We currently have 70 teens signed up at 4:30, and need a minimum of 5 more volunteers to meet the needs of our teenagers, and our 6:30 session has similar needs. The time commitment for being a small group mentor would require about 2 ½ hours weekly. 2 hours on Wednesday nights and 30 minutes of preparation before youth group. Saint of the Week, St. Rose of Lima *Feast Day is August 23*




Born Isabel Flores de Olivia in April 1586 in Lima, Peru to Spanish colonists, Saint Rose of Lima took the name Rose at her confirmation in 1597. Legend holds that she received this nickname as an infant because a servant saw her face transformed into a rose.

Even as a child Saint Rose was dedicated to Christ. Growing up she made many secret penances. And when she was old enough to be married, deterred suitors by cutting off her hair and rubbing pepper on face to make it blister. She took a vow of chastity even though her parents wished her to marry. She fasted many times a week and permanently abstained from meat. Eventually her parents gave in and allowed her to join the Third Order of St. Dominic, although she was not permitted to live in a convent. Saint Rose undertook severe penances, allowing herself only two hours of sleep a night in order to have more time to pray, wearing a heavy silver crown with spikes on the inside imitating Christ's crown of thorns, and even burning her own hands. However, she also cared for the sick and hungry, and sold her beautiful embroidery and fine lace, as well as flowers she grew to help raise funds for the poor. She died at the age of 31 on August 24, 1617. Pope Clement X canonized her in 1671, she was the first saint of the New World, born in the Americas. Saint Rose of Lima is the patron saint of Latin America and the Philippines.

Everyday Stewardship **Chancing the Narrow Gate**

From doctors to counselors, anthropologists to schoolteachers, it seems like everyone has their own parenting style to peddle, guaranteeing it will result in a happy and well-adjusted kid. You’ve got “gentle parenting,” predicated on respect for the child’s feelings and needs. You’ve got “attachment parenting,” based on the belief that kids need time to adjust to being outside of the womb. You’ve got “free-range parenting,” where self-sufficiency reigns supreme. But of all the parenting approaches I’ve come across, I’ve never encountered a philosophy that rejects discipline altogether. There are lots of conflicting opinions on how best to administer that discipline, but I’ve never heard any parent or parenting “expert” worth their salt say that a mother or father should completely ignore misbehavior that threatens the well-being of the child himself. Discipline is in our human DNA. Consider for a moment what the world would look like if it came to be filled with people who had never been taught to reflect on their life challenges. People who bristled at the suggestion of personal growth. And yet we become this way with God. Even the most “devout” among us shy away from occasions of divine constructive criticism. We avoid confession and forego daily examinations of conscience. We keep things superficial in our prayer life, avoiding depth of heart and real intimacy with God, afraid of what He will speak to us. But when we do this, we rob ourselves of an opportunity to rely on God’s fatherly strength, to rest in His mercy, to fill ourselves up with His goodness. We’re putting up our hands, saying: “No thanks, Father, I’m good. You can keep your discipline. You can keep your grace.” When we do this, we are making a beeline for the “narrow gate,” sure of our own strength and ability to pass through it. All I can say is this, proceed at your own peril. Are you so sure of yourself?

Question:

How can I practice gratitude in my everyday life?


Answer:

God has given each of us many blessings. Fostering an "attitude of gratitude" might be easier than you think. Simple, concrete practices can help us to be more thankful more often. Incorporate it into your dinner with your spouse, or as you tuck the kids into bed at night. "What are three things you're thankful for today?" Make a habit of writing one note a week to someone special in your life, thanking them for how they've impacted you. This is also a good practice in the workplace. Consider opening your weekly meetings with a quick round of gratitude sharing. "I'm grateful John helped me with that last-minute change to my presentation last week. I wouldn't have finished it in time for the meeting without him."

Another way is to designate a few minutes to thank God. This could be the first bit of your daily prayer time or after you receive communion on Sundays. You can also integrate it into your daily routine. How about while brushing your teeth? There's probably nothing so important it can't wait two minutes. Brush your teeth, quiet your mind, and thank God from your heart for His blessings throughout the day. Get creative! Any moment is an opportunity to praise and thank God.




