



## **FOUNDATION STONES**



At our parish, our "currency" is measured through our Five Foundation Stones—core principles that guide and enrich our journey of faith. These foundational elements are what truly help us grow deeper in our Catholic faith and live it more fully each day. Through Eucharistic Encounters, Reconciliation, Scripture, Fasting, and the Rosary, we open ourselves more fully to God's grace and grow in relationship with Jesus Christ and His Church.

### **EUCHARISTIC ENCOUNTERS**

Encountering the Eucharist is a profound and personal way to connect with Jesus, experiencing His presence and love. We believe that Jesus is truly present—body, blood, soul, and divinity—in the Eucharist. The Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our faith, where we receive spiritual nourishment and participate in Christ's sacrifice and Resurrection. Through Eucharistic Adoration, we spend time in prayer and contemplation with Jesus. It provides an opportunity for us to encounter Him personally in a way that transcends ordinary experiences.



### RECONCILIATION

Monthly participation in the Sacrament of Reconciliation (Confession) is strongly recommended for Catholics seeking to grow in holiness and deepen their relationship with God, even if they have not committed mortal sins. While the Church requires Confession at least once a year, frequent Confession offers a variety of spiritual benefits.

### **SCRIPTURE**

The Bible contains God's love letters to us, written by humans under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit. Reading the Bible is a way to learn about God's character, understand His plan, and discover how to live a meaningful life aligned with His will. It provides guidance, wisdom, and hope, ultimately leading to a deeper relationship with God and a transformed life.



### **FASTING**

Fasting is essential in order to achieve spiritual freedom. Through fasting, one is better able to listen to God and man and to perceive them more clearly. If, through fasting, we achieve that freedom, we will be more aware of many things. Once we are aware that we can enjoy the necessities of life without struggle, then many fears and worries fade away. We become more open to our families and to the people with whom we live and work. Fasting can be from food or other vices that keep us from our relationship with Jesus.

### **ROSARY**

Praying the Rosary combines vocal prayer with meditation on the life of Jesus Christ and his mother, Mary. It's a way to deepen one's relationship with God, find peace, and seek Mary's intercession. It is also a powerful tool against sin and a source of grace. What better way to know Jesus than through the one who knew him best...His mother.



## SACRAMENTS OF INITIATION

We recognize that sacraments are deeply personal and sacred moments in the life of a family and we take a great care in providing the proper education and assistance to our parishioners that are receiving the sacraments.



### **BAPTISM**

Baptisms take place the first four Sundays of the month after the 11:00 am Mass. Baptismal Preparation Class is required for parents and Godparents. 




